Background

The Dr M L Dhawale Memorial Trust was established in 1987, after the untimely demise of Dr. M. L. Dhawale, an M.D who was a practicing Homoeopath. To fulfill his vision of service to Humanity through the spread of Scientific and Standardized Homoeopathy established the Trust by his students and patients. The Mission of the Trust is "Excellence in Integrated Homoeopathic Medical Care, Education, & Research to promote "Positive Health" in a cost-effective manner.



Unique beneficiary stories

1. Diagnosis: Operated for Haemorrhoids.

One 32-year-old female from Vedhi, Saphale having two children total of four number members of the family. Occupation: Small poultry farming. She was a Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana beneficiary. The patient **was a widow** and suffering from bleeding per rectum for many days,

Her husband died during the pandemic. She was facing a big financial crisis. Children go to school. This patient attended our free health camp. After camp, we have done free-of-cost surgery for this patient. We had provided support from Blue Star for some tests (X-ray, ECG, USG) and some help from the hospital's Charity Fund. The ration card was orange and the monthly income was 6000/- . She is happy for the treatment received at our hospital with financial support.



2. Department: Orthopaedics

Diagnosis: Right tibia proximal end medial and lateral metaphysical fracture. A male patient of 65 old at Bidco, Palghar.

History: The patient fell on his right hand while playing with his grandson. But after eight days, the pain in the arm worsened, after which the patient was admitted to our hospital. The patient was advised to undergo an operation and the cost of the operation was $\gtrless 48,000$. The patient earns **his**



livelihood by collecting plastic bottles from the street. The patient has two children who also do the same job. The patient could not afford the cost. We provided free of cost services for his health/ treatment from our various donors.

3. Department: Paediatrics

One baby of two months old, from Dhanani Nagar, Bpoisar, Palghar.

History: This was the third delivery of the baby's mother & delivery done at another Hospital, due to pain in the 7th month. The weight of the baby after delivery was only 900 grams. The patient was admitted to our hospital on 21/01/2023 as the baby required NICU but the financial condition of the patient was not enough to pay the hospital bill. Doctor said that it will take approximately 2 months for the baby to gain weight more than 1.5 kg and the hospital expenses may be 2 or 2.5 lakhs. Considering the financial situation of the patient, the baby was kept in the hospital for 45 days and was released safely after the baby gained 1 kg 600 grams. At 45 days, the baby had great support for X-rays.

Diagnosis: Pre-term with very low birth weight (PLBW) with Respiratory Distress Syndrome

Occupation: Daily worker, with no ration card.

Family members: 4 (wife and 2 children)

Support from Blue Star Fund for X-RAY and treatment from IPN Scholle

Total treatment cost ₹2,38,550/- supported by our Donors.





We care for adolescent girls as well so we visit schools to take care sessions and check-ups, especially about menstrual cycle and anemia by using IEC material. Specialists Dr. Sujata Ma'am and Dr Trupti Ma'am conduct these sessions at schools. Below are the statistics for the same.

Education vertical 22-23

Almost all children suffered from the two years of lockdown and loss of direct teacher-student contact. More than 70% of the children did not have access to any online education. Consequently, the previously weak scholastic levels radically dropped further. The Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan ensured that a pre-covid child of 5th standard had moved to 8th standard, but she had no knowledge of 6th and 7th standards.

Our Education team decided to bridge this gap as fast as possible. We formed a team of 6 existing wellrespected teachers from the schools in the vicinity, 2 from each stream of Maths, Science & English. We identified a team of 10 recently graduated young boys & girls. We called them Vidhyarthi Mitra. The teachers were given the task of training the Vidhyarthi Mitras every Sunday. The Vidhyarthi Mitra would in turn visit various schools during the next week and impart the lesson plans they had prepared with the teachers. During the year we reached out to 9 schools and more than 2000 students. The program was very well received by the students, appreciated by the teachers. We are inundated with requests from many more schools to extend the program to their schools too.

The 21st century is a competition age and in this age the knowledge of information technology is a must. However, in the rural area children do not have the access to basic computers and Information Technology. Therefore the 'Computer literacy' program was implemented with students. In this the children were given basic information about computer and Word excel and power point with the help of the internet they could find the information, data and knowledge related to their academic study and in General.

Dr M. L. Dhawale Memorial Trust's Charitable Services, Pune

The last 2 years have been significant in developing insight and mobilizing resources towards developing this center as per our mission of excellence in providing homoeopathic care in a cost effective manner.

GERIATRIC CARE CENTER

Post the last wave of Covid-19, a need was felt to address the senior citizen's health issues after realizing the enormous impact of the pandemic. The physical, emotional, financial, familial, and social cost was tremendous. Above all the threat to life was acute.

W offer clinical services at as low as 50% rates for patients above 60 years of age. We have taken up various awareness lectures and health activities on issues of geriatric health issues eg. Osteoporosis and Joint diseases, Mental health, lifestyle diseases, etc.

OSTEOPOROSIS PROJECT

(August 14, 2023)

We did a pilot project to study the efficacy of homeopathy (in low potency 6x) in osteoporosis. About 100 pts were screened of which 30 pts took treatment for 3 months and were evaluated on the basis of subjective and objective criteria (BMD study).

We could give subjective relief to 80% patients while about 30 % pts showed improvement in the BMD study. Though we could not conduct a proper systematic study due to resource limitations, it definitely gave confidence to us as well as the pts that homoeopathy can help in treating geriatric conditions.

We could create awareness about osteoporosis through lectures and flyers in the geriatric community. Also we could highlight the importance of diet, exercise, daily walk and yoga through the activity.

WOMEN'S HEALTH ACTIVITY: (Women's day March 2023)

Women's health is an important isssue. We conducted health awareness and screening activity for women. It included breast examination, obesity evaluation, thyroid testing along with general and systemic examination. About 63 females from various age groups benefited. We could produce awareness about female health issues of breast tumors, menstrual health, menopause, thyroid as well as joint disorders and anemia which was common. A few pts who were diagnosed with thyroid diseases were enrolled under our thyroid research activity at Deenanath Mangeshkar hospital Pune.

We could stress upon the importance of a female feeling empowered and giving equal importance to her own health and wellbeing as she does for the family.

Clinical Activity: The preparation for various clinical activities involves preparation on part of physicians and students at a level of clinical knowledge and homoeopathy which helps in the long run. Guidance of seniors, especially Dr. Phansalkar sir helped to improve our clinical services.



The canter caters to the health needs of senior citizens, women and children and we are planning our activities accordingly.

We could gather help from a few generous donors and well-wishers for our activities. However, we need more help to be able to carry out the activities regularly.

ICR Clinical Centre Gururaj Society, Paud Road, Pune

The community available around the clinical center was approached with the view of providing good quality medical services at affordable rates.

- We assigned a specific disorder to the physicians attending the OPD
- Diabetes and Lifestyle disorders
- Allergies
- Pediatrics
- Thyroid
- Menstrual Disorder and Infertility
- Psychiatry

We received a good response for the same.

Research Activity Carried out at Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital

A study of Efficacy of Homoeopathic indicated medicines as an adjuvant therapy in hypothyroidism was conducted during 01/09/2021 and 16/03/2023. The conjoint study was conducted by the department of Homoeopathy, Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital and Endocrine department of Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital. The study was carried out under the valuable guidance of Dr. Vaishali Chetan Deshmukh (MD Medicine, Superspeciality Endocrinologist) and Dr. Shirish K. Phansalkar (HOD Homoeopathy DMH). About 80 patients were enrolled for the study, out of which 60 patients completed the study. All the laboratory tests required for the study primarily and for the follow ups were done free of charge. Along with the lab parameters, quality of life (QOL) was one of the important parameters for understanding the effect of homoeopathic-indicated medicines. QOL approved by WHO which is available for public use was used as a tool. The patients were asked to fill out the Questionnaire of QOL at the start of the study and again after 6 months at the end of the study. During the study period, the patients were provided with free breakfast and tea. Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital laboratory department extended a 20% discount on all laboratory tests done during the study. Enrollment for the research study and a few patients' unexpected withdrawal, extended the duration of the study. At the end of the study, we witnessed satisfactory results at the level of the autoimmune process in Hypothyroidism as well as in improved QOL of the patients.

MLDT's Urban Charitable Services, Mumbai

Dr. M.L. Dhawale Trust runs 4 Homoeopathic Charitable Clinics in Mumbai and its suburbs for the lower socioeconomic needy strata of the community since 1984 at Deonar, Jogeshwari, Mahul, and Ghansoli are in collaboration with like -minded organisations.

The objective of urban clinical services is to provide quality health services to the needy urban community at charitable rates. This has been possible through our dedicated and sincere team of ICR trained physicians who have been constantly striving to achieve our motto of promising 'Quality assurance in a cost-effective way'.

MAHUL CLINIC

The clinic is situated in the Mahul village- Balwadi centre. This clinic was started in 1991 in co- ordination with BPCL & Mahul Nagrik Dakshata Samiti. It caters to the health-care needs of Mahul village & the surrounding colony, consisting mainly of the fisher folk. Along with the clinical activity, social development activity is also done. In the past we have organized many health care camps for the benefit of the village. Cases seen are mainly of Skin disorders, Chronic Bronchitis, Osteoarthritis, Bronchial Asthma, Allergic respiratory disorder, etc.

CLINICAL SERVICES


Clinic timings-

Monday to Friday Morning-10 am to 1 noon.

Saturday Afternoon - 2 pm to 5 pm

Services:

- 3 physicians provide clinical services, each coming for 2 days a week.
 - Dr. Manisha Nadkarni
 - Dr. Kanchan Rajpal
 - Dr. Sneha Seth
- Compounder- Mrs. Alka Gurav, maintains the records, dispenses medicines to patients and keeps the clinic clean. She has been working for this clinic since its inception in 1991.
- Activities carried out by clinic- One orientation lecture is taken for village people on any topic. Topic is chosen on clinical experiences which physicians get while treating cases. Like, this year MENOPAUSE was chosen as ladies have many doubts about it and they hesitate to talk about it. So, a lecture followed by question answer session was taken in September 22.




It can be seen from above chart, that Average number of patients in clinic range from 350 to 450 per month.

Maximum new cases are seen in months of July, November and March. July ,August are months with maximum rains of the year. So illnesses like cough, cold, fever , asthma are more in these months.

Also above months and February, March are the months when schools are open and people are present in Mumbai. This accounts for maximum patients visiting clinic.

Minimum patients are seen in April, May and October, In these months schools are closed. So people from Mahul go and stay at their native place.

This year there was a cold wave in month of January. That had made a rise in complaints of musculoskeletal system. Knee pain and multiple joint pain cases had increased.



Paediatric patients throughout the year

It was seen that number of children visiting clinic was less, but this year, there has been a steady rise in children coming to clinic for treatment.

Common health issues seen in children this year

1] Recurrent cough and cold- Frequency of complaints can be reduced to a great extent with Homoeopathic medicines.

This year maximum children had this complaint.

2] Spots on face- Intermittently children come with this complaint. Medicines with improved diet showed that , the spots disappeared.


3] Worms infestation- This complaint has reduced than what it was few years back. The reason being orientation of villagers about hygiene , given by our physicians.

4]Scabies- We treated few cases this year. Frequency of this infection has also reduced to a great extent.

5] Bed Wetting- Few cases are seen every year. This condition responds very well to Homoeopathic Medication.

6] Allergic sneezing- This year, few such cases were treated successfully.

Summary of clinical conditions seen in 2022-2023



Observations about clinical conditions seen in 2022-2023

1] **Musculoskeletal system**- Every year clinic sees maximum cases belonging to Musculoskeletal system [Joints and muscles].Knee joint pain, frozen shoulder, Lumbar disc diseases{ backpain}.

Reason for this-Occupation, is main cause for this. Koli women and men carry weight of fish basket and they are sitting in wrong posture [Bending back]. This produces undue pressure on bones of spine and it leads to illnesses'

2] **Gastrointestinal system-** In past years, there were many cases of piles and fissures. This year, cases of GERD were more compared to piles cases.

Reason for this-People in Mahul have lot of stress in their life – Financial also about education of children.


All this leads to diseases like GERD [acidity], also faulty diet, which is a part of present peoples lifestyle causes acidity.

3] Skin-Fungal skin infections were maximum last year and in first quarter of year. These improved as the year progressed.

The frequency of new cases of fungal infections definitely reduced in last 4-5 months

4] This year cases of allergy-either allergic rhinitis [cold], allergic bronchitis, and urticarial [Hives] were seen all throughout the year

Orientation about constipation and piles

A lecture for benefit ov village people on topic of piles was taken on 30th January 2023 in balwadi premises.

Piles is frequently occurring complaint in people but they find awkward to discuss about it.

In this lecture, information about how untreated constipation can form piles was explained and in the end, importance of high fibre diet was told. Group freely communicated clarifying their doubts.

The number of students screened is as follows:

Screening Process:

- A brief assessment of the general and mental health (hyperactivity/ inattention/emotional/ scholastic issues/ recurrent absentees) was done by the respective class teachers prior to the camp.
- This assessment was followed by a questionnaire especially designed to assess the functioning of the child in the school at various levels, to be filled by the teachers.
- The team of doctors comprised of qualified physicians from the Dr. M. L. Dhawale Memorial Trust.
- Screening of Nursery, Junior and Senior KG sections, Balwarg and Shishuwarg was done division wise, for both mental & physical health.
- Each child was screened for present or past complaints along with height and weight assessment. This was followed by physical check- up of the child.
- Parents having doubts regarding their child's health were spoken to and guided accordingly. They were encouraged to adopt Homoeopathy as the treatment modality as the children prefer the 'sweet pills' and because Homoeopathy helps with a rapid and gentle cure for the illnesses.
